

DARTS SCORE BOARD INSTRUCTIONS

The darts score board has been designed, created and tested with one thing in mind, simplicity. We therefore believe that even the less computer savvy should be able to open the file and immediately start using the program, this has been the case during testing too.

However we have put together some instructions to read prior to opening the file, it should enhance your experience.

Enjoy the Darts!



Once you see the message below you must click on 'Yes' ensuring that you have to save the completed scores

Opening the Score Board in 'Read Only' mode.

Once you see the message below you must click on 'Yes' ensuring that you have to save the completed scores with a new file name. This also means each time you open the scoreboard you will have an empty template to add the scores into.



Enabling Macros

The darts score board uses Macros – a little more information about them below:

If you perform a task repeatedly in Microsoft Excel, you can automate the task with a macro. A macro is a series of commands and functions that are stored in a Microsoft Visual Basic module and can be run whenever you need to perform the task.

Because some viruses can be transmitted by Macros, Excel provides safeguards that help protect you. This is why whenever you open a workbook that contains macros you need to enable them before they can be used. Dependant on your macro security settings will decide if you see the following page on the score board, if you see it simply follow the instructions on the screen.

You must enable Macros to use this Darts Scorer

Enabling Macros in Excel 2007

1. Click the Microsoft Office Button
2. Click Trust Center, click Trust Center Settings, and then click Macro Settings
3. Click Enable all macros.

Enabling Macros in Excel 2010

The exact steps for enabling macros for Excel 2010 will vary depending on the security levels set in your program. These instructions presume that all protective view and macro settings are at their default settings and that macros are allowed in Excel.

1. Open the file.
2. The file will open in Protective View.
3. Click Enable Editing on the message bar.

 **Security Warning** Macros have been disabled.

4. Security warning in the message bar asking if you would like to Enable Content.

Score Board Options

Before the score board opens you will see the options popup, this is where you select your game choices, see below for additional information.



Below you can see a screen shot of the darts score board.


Enter Team Names

In the admin panel you will see a button named 'Enter Team Names' once clicked a popup box appears where you enter both teams and click 'Add Names' button. Once clicked the teams name will appear on the score board (as below)



Add Players

Click the 'Add Home Player' and 'Add Away Player' buttons also found in the admin panel. Again pop up boxes appear where the player names are added once 'Add Name' has been clicked.




Start Match

Once the names have been entered it's time to start the game, just follow the arrows, click start match to begin. Based on your original selections the score board will know exactly where to go and what to do!



Finishing Darts

Once a winning double hit been hit the score board calculates the possible number of darts that could have been used to hit the finish. Example 60 (will show 2 and 3) – simply click the button that relates to the number of darts the player used to finish.



Once you click on the relevant finishing number you will notice the red box will become white, the arrow will disappear and the 'NUMBER OF DARTS REGISTERED' message is shown.




Follow the Arrows

Simply follow the arrows and you can't go wrong!



Error Correcting

We know that sometimes during a darts match scores can be incorrectly entered. With this in mind when a score or a finish is entered that isn't possible the score board will state 'ERROR' and a message will pop up asking if you want to correct the error. Simply click 'Yes' and the score will be removed ready to enter the new one.
